OUR STORY

The American Institute of Dental Public Health was founded by Dr. David Cappelli and Dr. Annaliese Cothron in 2015, initially through funding from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Seeing gaps in organizational programming and the need to center health equity as a cornerstone of oral health education and training, AIDPH was established to pursue a mission of fostering professional excellence and advancing innovation in the education and practice of dental public health. Dr. Cothron serves as the Executive Director of AIDPH and Dr. Cappelli chairs the Board of Directors.

Now, five years later, AIDPH is an established 501(c)(3) nonprofit and the only national public health institute solely dedicated to oral health. We offer educational training for oral health professionals, support student growth and career development in dental public health, and serve as conveners of stature to facilitate systems change in the oral health community.

AIDPH believes that, as oral health equity advocates and leaders, it is our responsibility to address individual, institutional, and systemic barriers that keep communities from achieving optimal oral health across the lifespan. When marginalized communities can access dental care from providers who look like them, understand their needs, and support their culture, their oral health and overall health improves significantly. We advocate for oral health workforce diversity using the lens of our core values to galvanize students, public health professionals, policymakers, and thought leaders to invest in health equity.

Hosted a policy workshop on oral health policy and equity

AIDPH collaborated with the APHA Oral Health Section in May to support oral health professionals in using their voices to advance oral health equity. Added over 160 resources to the DPH-VRC

Throughout 2021, we added more than 160 resources on LBTQIA+ oral health, veteran oral health, value-based care, and many more. In total, the Dental Public Health Virtual Resource Center (DPH-VRC) now has more than 2600 scientific publications.

Expanded our professional development portfolio

Throughout 2021, we added recordings of workshops and webinars to increase visibility and access to dental public health scholarship via our <u>YouTube channel</u>. We now have more than 120 recordings publicly available to oral health professionals.

Our Executive Director presented nationally on important topics such as LGBTQ+ oral health, anti-racism, and oral health equity. You can view the slides using the links below.






Created the Oral Health Equality Act Toolkit

Following calls from national advocacy organizations, AIDPH created the Equality Act Toolkit for Oral Health Professionals in collaboration with other national organizations to educate senators on advancing equality for LGBTQ+ people. You can download the toolkit here.

Implemented our Summer Fellowship

With support from CareQuest Institute, AIDPH hosted a summer fellowship focused on research in implementation science, value-based care, and oral health equity. Preliminary findings from this research were presented in a webinar with additional results released next year through scientific publications.

Developed telementoring program for capacity building in rural oral health

In February, AIDPH participated in the Texas state delegation of OPEN in educating our federal legislators on important policies that can advance oral health equity, including Medicare expansion and enhanced CDC funding. In April, we joined Texas leaders in ADEA to discuss opportunities to support dental education and community partnerships for care delivery.

Following our credentialing in 2020 for Project ECHO, AIDPH developed its infrastructure to launch our ECHO Hub in early 2021. The ECHO model of telementoring aims to democratize knowledge by offering case-based discussion sessions set to equip health professionals in supporting clinical care. Launched the AIDPH **Corporate Leadership** Council

AIDPH added our endorsement to 17 letters circulated to legislators and national health community leaders in support of oral health equity, increased workforce capacity, and effective COVID response considerations. As thought leaders and advocates, AIDPH recognizes our responsibility to support the oral health workforce and the communities it serves.

Recognizing the need to bridge gaps in the public, private, and independent sectors, AIDPH began exploring how to serve as conveners of stature and trusted brokers of equity in oral health. Our leadership determined that a Corporate Leadership Council could expand our impact and increase opportunities for the broader oral health community. 
